Purpose	The Generative Artificial Intelligence in Teaching and Learning (AI) Working Group develops and monitors policies and guidelines around the use of generative AI in teaching and learning at Mount Royal. It provides relevant AI-related policy and guideline recommendations to the General Faculties Council (GFC), the Teaching and Learning Committee (sub-committee of GFC), and other groups, as appropriate.
Duration	The AI Working Group is expected to carry out its work over the 2024 calendar year, possibly extending its work to 2025 and/or being reestablished as an ongoing committee.

	<ul> <li>Consult with and provide Al-related recommendations to the appropriate committees such as the Teaching and Learning Committee and General Faculties Council. Recommendations may include:</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Additions to the required course syllabus</li> <li>Language options for course syllabi that address Al in consideration of the course pedagogy and assessments</li> <li>Additions to the Code of Student Academic Integrity Policy and Procedures</li> <li>Additions to the Code of Conduct - Employees</li> <li>Development of an Al-related policy for Mount Royal</li> <li>Other policies, documents or practices, as necessary</li> <li>Provide recommendations for the long-term role and structure of the Al Working Group to the Provost and Vice-President, Academic, and the Vice-President, Students, by December 2024.</li> <li>Provide recommendations for the operationalization of Al</li> </ul>
