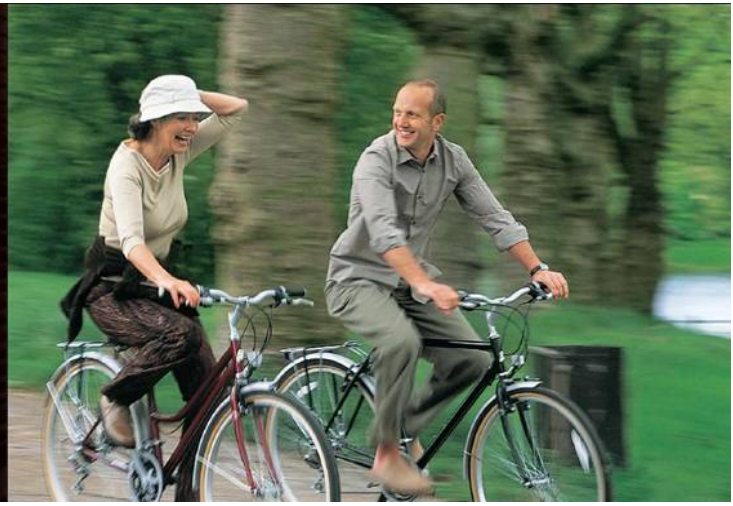

GEORGE PARRIS

George Parris has his Doctorate in Rehabilitation Counselor Education, with cognates in Counseling Psychology/Neuropsychology from Michigan State University. He is a certified rehabilitation counselor (CRC), license professional counselor (LPC), nationally certified psychologist (NCP), and is a diplomate of the American Board of Disability Analyst (ABDA). He is the Coordinator of the Rehabilitation Counseling Program at Wayne State University in Detroit, Michigan.

His research interests are psychosocial aspects and treatment issues of individuals with serious and persistent mental illness, impact of trauma in the development of mental illness, dual diagnosis disorders, traumatic brain injury (TBI), psychotherapeutic interventions, and cultural issues in adjusting to a disability. He has been in private practice since 1995 and has worked extensively with individuals with mental illness, substance abuse and co-existing disabilities, traumatic brain injuries and other cognitive disabilities. He specializes in psychotherapeutic interventions, cognitive/neuropsychological evaluations, psycho-vocational and psycho-educational evaluations, mental health training and organizational consultation and development. He has provided training to numerous organizations and has presented at many conferences.

SONJA GRBEVSKI

Sonja Grbevski has her doctorate in Counseling, with cognates in Rehabilitation Counseling and Educational Psychology from Wayne State University. She is the Director of Mental Health Services at Hotel Dieu-Grace Hospital in Windsor, Ontario, Canada. This includes three inpatient units with 68 beds, mental health outpatient services, emergency department psychiatric consultation nurses, community crisis program, injection clinic, and psychiatric liaison.

Previously, she was employed by Windsor Regional Hospital as a Manager for Specialized Mental health Programs, such as dual diagnosis, concurrent disorders, mood and anxiety disorders and acquired brain injury assessment program. Additional experience includes working at The Salvation Army Adult Rehabilitation Center and the Paul Martin Home for Boys in Detroit, Michigan.

She is also an Adjunct faculty at Wayne State University in the Rehabilitation Counseling program, where she is responsible for teaching Psychosocial Aspects of Disability, Diagnosis, Treatment and Intervention of Individuals with Dual Diagnosis, Diagnosis, Treatment and Intervention of Individuals with Severe and Persistent Mental Illness, and Professional Roles in Counseling classes. Her research interests are severe and persistent mental illness, co-occurring disorders, and trauma and disability. She has presented at numerous conferences and has provided training to many organizations.
