Language of Instruction	All courses are taught and exams written in the English language. Please note that some higher-level language courses will be taught mainly in that language.

Application Deadlines	May 1st – for exchange in Fall (September-December) October 1st – for exchange in Winter (January-April)

Fees and Expenses	<p>Depending upon the exchange agreement between MRC and the respective home institutions, an exchange student is normally required to pay the regular tuition fees to his/her home institution.</p> <p>Students are required to pay Residence fees (application fee, damage deposit and rent fees) to MRC Residence Services. Residence	<p>Most exchange students apply to live in MRC Residence. The most popular and economical rooms are 4-bedroom apartments or townhouses, where students have their own room but share the rest of the apartment (kitchen, living room and two bathrooms) with 3 other students.</p> <p>The College does not operate any meal plan. There is a student cafeteria and many of food kiosks on campus that provide a variety of meals. There are also restaurants in the neighborhoods off campus.</p> <p>Please note all students must apply for MRC Residence. Recreation	<p>Included with full-time study is unlimited access to MRC Recreation center, 200m track, salt water swimming pool, weight room facility, squash courts, etc. Independent classes are available for additional fees.</p> <p>MRC Recreation http://www.mtroyal.ca/recreation/</p>		
Medical Insurance	<p>Students are required to enroll in the MRC Mandatory Medical Insurance plan, Student Guard. We will automatically enroll all exchange students prior to arrival and students will pick up and pay for their policy at Orientation. The cost of this plan is \$200 for one term (4 months).</p>		
Study Permit & Visa	<p>Students studying in Canada for less than 6 months, DO NOT require a Study Permit to study in Canada. Students may need a Temporary Residence Visa to enter Canada, depending on their home country. http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/visit/visas.asp</p> <p>Students who plan to study in Canada for 6 months or longer, must apply for a Study Permit, prior to coming to Canada. Working part-time on campus - students will need a Study Permit prior to arrival. More information on can be found at http://www.cic.gc.ca</p> <p>It is the students' responsibility to research and obtain the appropriate legal documents to be eligible to study in Canada please contact the Embassy or Consulate in your home country, prior to arrival. Please remember to bring your official acceptance letter to MRC with you to Canada.</p>		
Orientation	<p>A mandatory International Orientation will take place the day before the first day of classes. More details will be sent to you with your official acceptance package.</p>		
Airport Pickup	<p>Yes, available, upon request. Cost: \$65 one-way</p>		
Admission Requirements	<p>Nominated students should have good academic performance as well as conduct. A student, whose native language is not English, is required to have a TOEFL score of 220 (computer-based), or an IELTS score of 7.0.
