SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES AND OUTCOMES

The Teaching and Learning Committee mobilized early in the year, and in addition to the responsibilities delegated to us from the General Faculties Council, identified four priority areas for the committee. Working groups were created to address these as detailed below, with outcomes where appropriate, including recommendations for future work in the coming academic year. A summary of achievements is outlined here:

1. Learning Management System (LMS) Renewal Project

- a. The TLC is excited to announce Cheryl Techentin (Associate Professor, Psychology) as the chair of the LMS working group of TLC for the coming academic year (effective April 2021)
- b. LMS project received executive approval to proceed (fall 2020)
 - i. Project executive sponsor is Elizabeth Evans, Provost and Vice President, Academic
 - ii. Project business sponsor is Mike Quinn, Vice-Provost and AVP, Academic
 - iii. Project technical sponsor is Leona LaChance, Chief Information Officer
- c. LMS Steering Committee charter finalized (winter 2021)
 - i. Members of steering committee are: Mike Quinn, Leona LaChance, Christian Cook, and Cheryl Techentin (student rep to be announced)
- d. FYI (this is outside of the LMS working group), the project manager has been identified for the LMS Renewal Project (announcement coming soon) (May 2021)
- e. All community members can check the ADC website for LMS updates (ongoing).

2. Development of Common Guidelines for Course Syllabi

a. Under the leadership of Chair, Shane Gannon, the team worked to create a series of recommendations and a template for common guidelines of course syllabi. This work and proposal were presented to GFC at its meeting on Friday, May 28, 2021.

3. The Future of Online Learning at Mount Royal University

a. Under the leadership of Chair, Amanda Veinotte, this working group has worked this year to identify possibilities and priorities for the future of online learning at MRU. While our core business remains face to face teaching in the undergraduate context, we have learned through the past year there is room for some opportunities to provide learning in alternative formats. Recommendations will consider opportunities to remove bottlenecks and improve student options and pathways, reduce letters of permissions for online courses outside of MRU taken by our students, and provide greater choice for our students, while honouring and preserving the value we place on teaching excellence informed by scholarship.

This extraordinary event was offered in a completely virtual environment from May 5-7, 2021. While we aim to host the event in person and on campus next year, we are already planning how to leverage technology to make this an even more accessible event.

This and other sessions can provide inspiration in course planning, and innovations in our physical and virtual classrooms.

New this year was the <u>Celebrate! Sparks Talks</u> format, which offered presenters just five minutes to share their perspectives, innovations, and learnings from the past year. This format was so well received that we will definitely be including it in next year's Celebrate! Event (and we'll get that date for you to save out soon!).

When the TLC reconvenes in the new academic year, we will discuss needs and resources for priorities that may include additional working groups.
