3. ChatGPT Group (for discussion)

It was explained that as a follow up to the January 2023 GFC meeting, where it was proposed from the floor to strike an ad hoc committee to address the impacts and possible response to ChatGPT and other artificial intelligence tools, the Chair, Dr. Tim Rahilly, with guidance from the Executive Committee of GFC, asked TLC to take up this work during the current academic year.

Discussion took place on how TLC can address this work within their mandate. This included discussing what is understood about the emerging issues, sufficiency of existing policy to address the issues of plagiarism and AI as a source, how it is being addressed by other areas at the university, and how an instructor could use the course syllabus to provide guidance to their students on the use of AI.

TLC agreed to reconstitute the Syllabus Guidelines working group to create guidelines for syllabi content that relate to student use of AI. Suggested wording will be brought forward to TLC for review at the next meeting.

A status update on the call for proposals was given, encouraging members to talk to their colleagues about submitting a proposal, including students. The DFA awards recipients will be part of a panel during the day and announce the new winners.
