It is the responsibility of the student to ensure all graduation requirements are met. Use this Degree Planning tool in conjunction with mruGradU8, the Academic Calendar, MyMRU, MSB and the BHPE Program Planning Guides. Bachelor degree students must take a minimum of 72 credits at the senior level (24 - 3 credit courses or equivalent at 2000 level or higher). In order to ensure this requirement is met, it is recommended that students choose courses from the 2000 level or higher to fulfill Electives and General Education, Tier 2 courses where possible. A minimum grade of C is required in all core/major courses in the BHPE degree.

### How do I register for courses?

### How do I access my mruGradU8 worksheet?

Login to mruGradU8 through [MyMRU](#); you will find the link on the My Program tab.

### What is the difference between a full-time and a part-time student?

A full-time student must be registered in a minimum of 9 credits per semester to a maximum of 15 credits per semester. A part-time student is one who registers in fewer than nine credits per semester. For the purposes of government funding, living in residence or eligibility for varsity athletics, you must be a full-time student in each of the Fall and Winter semesters.

### Where do I find important dates for the academic year?

### What is an elective?

An elective is any 3 credit course (or equivalent) course that does not fulfill either a program requirement or a general education requirement. Electives provide you with flexibility to pursue other subjects of interest outside your program. (Two 1.5 HPED courses can be used to fulfill a 3 credit elective).

### Do I need to apply to graduate from Mount Royal?

Yes - you need to Apply to [Graduate](#) from Mount Royal. Deadlines for submitting this form can be found in the [Academic Calendar](#) and on the [Critical Dates](#) page.

### How long do I have to complete my program?

[Degrees](#) must be completed within eight years of admission to the program.
