Kelly Hewson

PROFESSOR EMERITA

Dr. Kelly Hewson has earned the respect of her peers for her teaching, scholarship and wide-ranging service to Mount Royal.

Hewson joined Mount Royal in 1992 when she was appointed as a full-time instructor in the Department of English. She subsequently became a tenured professor, recognized for her expertise in postcolonial literature.

Hewson served on numerous committees, including the Board of Governors. She also reinvigorated programs in English and General Education, including the Writer in Residence program, by enlisting the Giller Prize-winning Canadian author Austin Clarke. In 2003, Hewson brought the prestigious Commonwealth Book Prize event to Mount Royal.

Her list of recognitions includes being a Nexen Scholar, a Distinguished Faculty Award recipient and a SAMRU Teaching Excellence Award winner.

Hewson's passion for teaching and pedagogy is evident in her scholarship. She is currently doing research on the intersection of film studies pedagogy and Canadian identity.

Todd Hirsch

HONORARY DEGREE

Todd Hirsch is considered one of the most prominent economists in Alberta and is in high demand as a public speaker and an authority on economics and public policy. He regularly provides commentary for news outlets throughout Canada.

Since 2007, Hirsch has been the chief economist at ATB Financial. Previously, he held positions in economics and policy with the Canada West Foundation, Canadian Pacific Railway and the Bank of Canada. His public policy interests and roles are diverse. Hirsch has served as chair of the Alberta Premier's Council on Culture and the Calgary Arts Academy, and is currently a member of the Alberta Economic Development Authority. A regular volunteer at Mount Royal, he participates in many events organized by the Department of Economics, Justice and Policy Studies, and the Mount Royal Alumni Association.

Hirsch is a recipient of the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal for outstanding contributions to the country and the community. In 2012, he was named one of Alberta's 50 Most Influential People by *Alberta Venture* magazine.

He has authored three books; his latest, published this spring, is *Spiders in Space: Successfully Adapting to Unwanted Change*.

Oluwademilade “Demi” Okuboyejo

VALEDICTORIAN

Oluwademilade “Demi” Okuboyejo began studying at Mount Royal in 2014, having spent the previous two years at the University of Alberta. An accomplished and well-rounded student, she leaves Mount Royal with a 3.90 cumulative GPA. Okuboyejo earned a Bachelor of Arts with a Policy Studies major and minors in Business and Political Science. She was on the Dean's Honour Roll over the past six semesters and made the President's Honour Roll for the past two years. Active on campus, Okuboyejo was the president of the Policy Studies Students' Society and secretary of the Afro-Caribbean Students' Society. She participated in the Alberta Intercollegiate Model United Nations Conference at which she received an award for her opening speech. Okuboyejo was also the recipient of the prestigious General John de Chastelain Scholarship for superior academic achievement and contributions to the community.

OUR SCHOLARLY traditions



REGALIA

The tradition of academic gowns, hoods and caps (called regalia) dates back to the Middle Ages. You will notice the Platform Party members wear unique regalia representing their university, level of academic achievement and area of knowledge. Academic dress is prescribed by Oxford and Cambridge. It is the Cambridge gown style that is worn by our graduates.

The hood goes back to the Middle Ages when begging friars placed goods into the hood. Mount Royal follows the Oxford hood style. The borders of the hood display a colour associated with the degree being conferred.

The headwear is known as a mortar board and hails from Ancient Greece when a felt hat was worn on top of a skull cap. The current style comes from Oxford and Cambridge.

OUR COAT OF ARMS

Arms: The design was created in 1912 by Vincent Massey, likely with Alexander Scott Carter. The original colours were replaced by the University's blue and white colours. Our name is reflected in the mace, which symbolizes royal authority, and the triangular shapes, which reflect mountains.

Crest: The bighorn sheep is Alberta's provincial animal and the book indicates the University is a place of learning. The dove alludes to our origins as a Methodist and United Church college.

Motto — Quam bene non quantum:

In place since the University's foundation, the motto means, "How well, not how much."

Supporters: The cougars refer to the names of Mount Royal's sports teams. The base of the Rockies and the maces refer to the University's name.

Original concept: Vincent Massey (arms) and Bruce Patterson, Deputy Chief Herald of Canada (crest, supporters and colours), assisted by the heralds of the Canadian Heraldic Authority.
