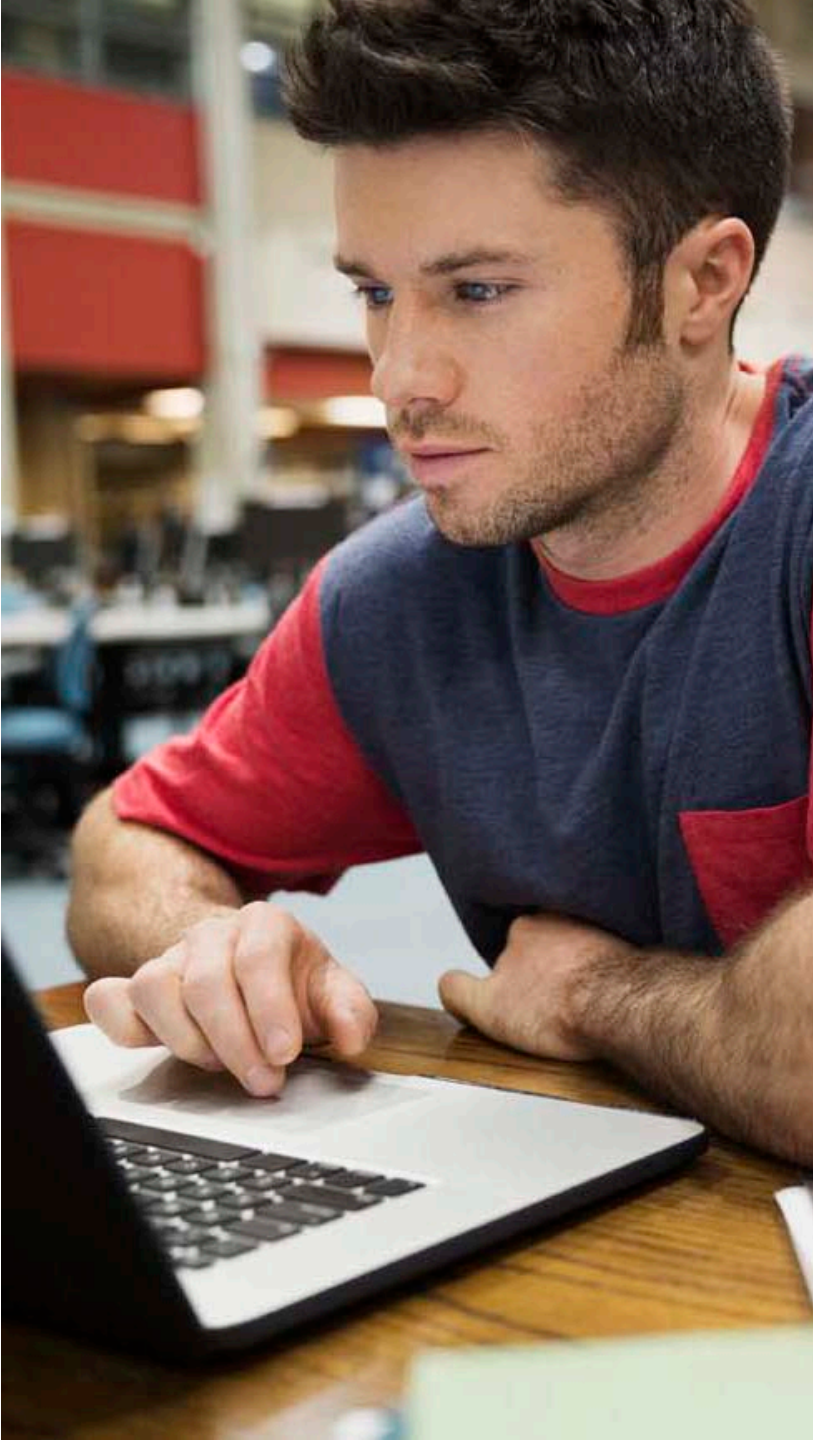

- » Access to a variety of post-secondary (credit) courses
- » Access to high school upgrading courses



YOUR CHECKLIST

To be eligible for a new program for Fall 2020 you **must** meet the following requirements:

- Apply for your new program during early admission
- Meet the competitive average for your intended program
- Complete all program specific admission requirements by June 30, 2020
- Meet the overall average by June 30, 2020

Apply on time!

- » **Must apply during Early Admission: October 1, 2019 to February 1, 2020**
- » May apply for up to two programs
- » Must self-report all high school upgrading courses to be completed by June 30, 2020
- » Apply online through your MyMRU account

Competitive GPA Requirement

High School & Mature Applicants	Post-secondary Applicants
Complete fewer than eight post-secondary courses by June 30, 2020 (including transfer credit)	Complete four or more post-secondary courses by December 31, 2019 (including transfer credit) <i>and</i> Complete eight or more post-secondary courses by June 30, 2020 (including transfer credit)
Calculated on your top two completed Group A courses (high school, upgrading or post-secondary equivalents)	Calculated on your four most recently completed post-secondary courses (including transfer credit)
Your competitive average courses must be completed by December 31, 2019	Your competitive GPA courses must be completed by December 31, 2019

Post-Secondary Admission Plan

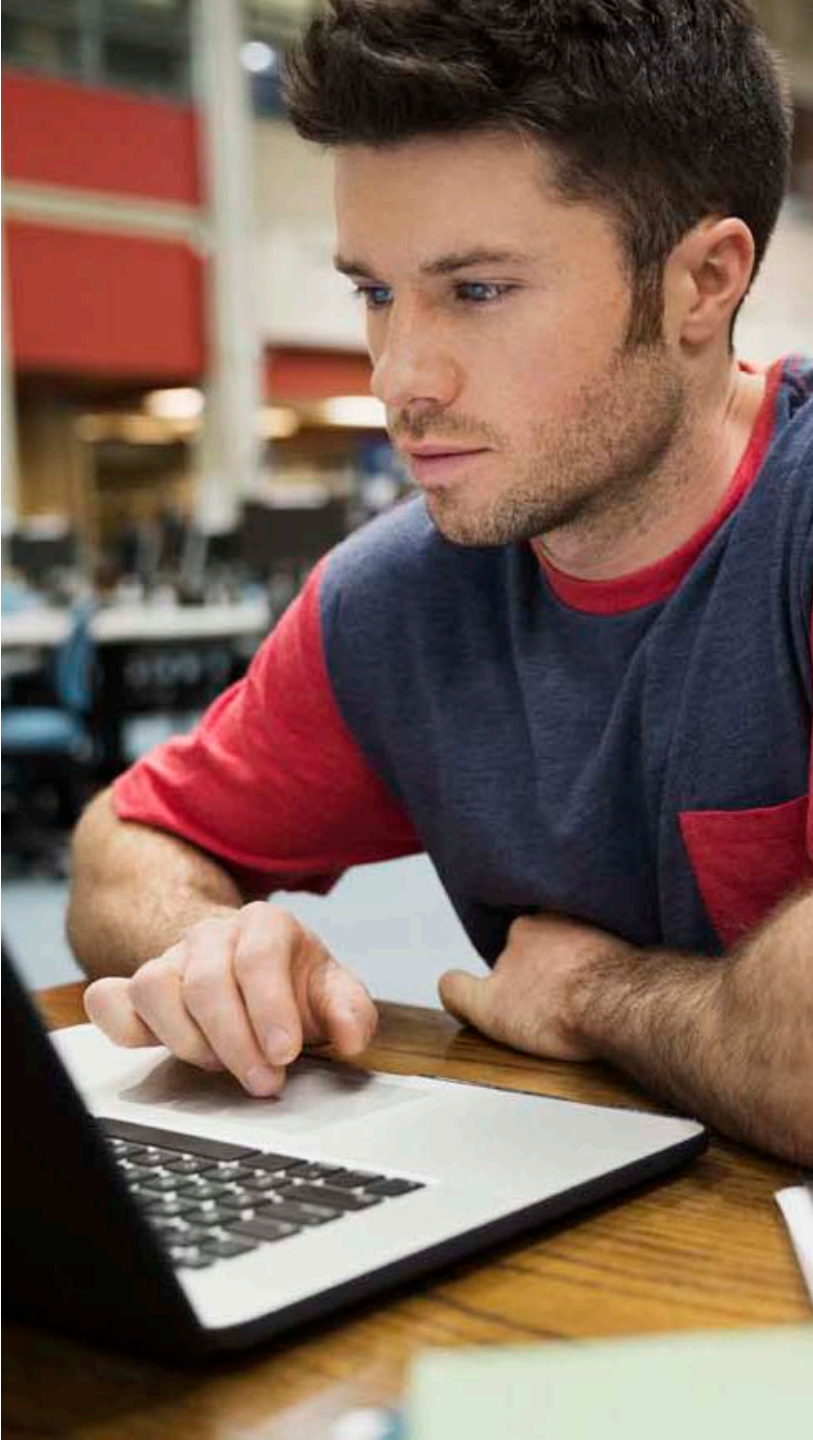
Fall Semester
