Indigenous Student Admission

Special consideration for designated seats is available in the program listed above through a program specific Indigenous Admission target.

To qualify for this category the applicant must:

1. self-identify as an Indigenous applicant on the Application for Admission
2. meet the definition of an Indigenous applicant
3. meet the minimum admission requirements as indicated in the general admission requirements for Mount Royal university as well as any program level admission requirements.

Designated seats will be filled by Indigenous applicants on a competitive basis. Applicants are encouraged to apply during Early Admission October 1 – February 1. Any unfilled designated seats will be released on July 15 to students applying under the general admission requirements.

Indigenous applicant definition

For the purpose of the application and admission process an Indigenous applicant is defined as a Canadian who is a Status Indian/First Nations, Non-Status Indian/First Nations, Métis, or Inuit.
