• What is my motivation to do this?

What focus do I want to be involved in?

» Advocacy? Crisis and emergency support? Mentoring or coaching?

What group do I want to help?

» Children and youth? Seniors? Women at risk? People in trouble with the law?

• What industry do I want to be in?

- » STEM? The arts? Education? Law?
- How much time can I realistically commit?
- How far do I want to travel?
 - » Within my neighborhood? Locally? Nationally? Internationally?
- How much training would I want to receive?
- What qualifications do I have? (skills, education or certifications)
- What type of volunteer role would prepare me for my dream career?

Why volunteer? You can...

- Explore careers, occupations, work environments and possible client groups.
- Gain relevant experience to add to your resume.
- Identify your skills, strengths, interests and personal values.
- Develop new skills and apply skills from school to a real-world setting.
- Grow your professional network and find positive references.

Land the role

- You can use the same strategies to find a volunteer position as you would to find a paid job. Attend networking events and volunteer *fairs*, look at postings online or directly contact companies to inquire about any volunteer opportunities.
- Analyze the volunteer position to get a strong understanding of the skills and qualifications that are required. Use this information when creating your targeted *resume*, *cover letter* or whatever else they specify to apply with.
