

Call for Human Research Ethics Board Faculty Reviewers

The Mount Royal University Human Research Ethics Board (HREB) is currently seeking full-time (tenured or tenurable) faculty members for June 2020. The Board consists of faculty, student, and community members, and is supported by staff from ORSCE. Although being an HREB Reviewer can be a heavy service load, it offers each member a valuable learning and practice opportunity. HREB members provide an important service to the University by ensuring that all research meets or exceeds existing ethical regulations.

Currently, HREB is seeking full-time faculty members with expertise in qualitative and quantitative research methods.

Preference will be given to interested candidates who:

- Have demonstrated experience in qualitative and quantitative research methods;
- Have demonstrated experience in submitting high quality HREB applications;
- Are able to read, understand and analyze complex issues from research proposals and weigh up conflicting opinions;
- Have good verbal and written communication skills, with a practical approach and the confidence to voice their opinions;
- Are comfortable discussing issues with people who may not agree with them, including being able to influence and listen to the views of others from a range of backgrounds;
- Are able to contribute to the work of the HREB (approximately 10 delegated (individual) reviews each and 4 to 5 full board reviews per academic year);
- Are available to attend meetings held the first Friday of every month (10 meetings per year) between 9:30am-12:00pm;
- Are committed to completing a 3-year term;
- Are available to begin the term in June 2020;
- Understand and can uphold the HREB requirement for confidentiality.

HREB appointments are made by the Provost and Vice President Academic. Each member term is for a minimum of 3 years, with the possibility of an additional one 3-year term renewal.
