Meeting	On 2019/08/28, Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) Officers met with the General Manager and Operations/Booking Manager with the Taylor Centre for the Performing Arts located on the Mount Royal University Campus in response to a complaint received by Alberta Occupational Health and Safety for the Bella Concert Hall located within the Taylor Centre for the Performing Arts.	August 28, 2019
	At the time of the meeting, no production was underway or in progress of being setup or dismantled in the Bella Concert Hall. The General Manager stated that Theatre Technicians setup, provide support during and dismantle productions based on the specific requirements for each individual production. The General Manager provided to OHS Officers electronic copies of the General Theatre Technician Position Description and Theatre Tech Mount Royal University Position Hazard Assessment and Control Form. In addition, an electronic copy of the Safe Stages - Best Practices, Theatre Alberta was also provided.	
	The General Manager stated that production requirements will vary for each production but include daily inspections of the stage and any production equipment including but not limited to rigging, lighting, sound and production sets. Daily inspections are documented by the Theatre Technicians who identify any hazards which require controls to be taken or put in place.	
	Occupational Health and Safety will not retain the electronic copies of the above noted Theatre Technician Position Description and Position Hazard Assessment and Control Form nor the Safe Stages - Best Practices.
